

MASC Trials Concept Development Workshop (CDW)

If you are working in melanoma or skin cancer research and are interested in attending a half-day CDW to further develop your concept and contribute to discussions with other researchers, then please register your interest. MASC Trials will facilitate the workshop, which aims to identify and address gaps in melanoma or skin cancer research and support MASC Trials members to develop their work in this area.

The workshop will be held on Thursday, 25 June 2026, 9AM to 1PM at 553 St Kilda Road, Melbourne, Ground floor, Conference Room 3 or alternatively via Zoom for interstate attendees.

Note that while MASC Trials will cover the cost of the workshop, researchers should cover their own travel expenses if attending in person.

The meeting will provide a supportive environment for intensive input on study design and methods from a multi-disciplinary faculty with expertise in melanoma and skin cancer, biostatistics, health economics, and quality of life as well as consumers.

Who can register their interest and how?

Expression of Interests (EOIs) are open to MASC Trials members or those interested in becoming a member, and interested in pursuing research in melanoma and skin cancer.

The review process:

EOIs will be reviewed by representatives from multiple DSA groups, MASC Trials Consumer Advisory Panel Chair, a QoL academic (CQUEST), and a health economist (CREST). Investigators with proposals selected for discussion at the CDW will be notified shortly after the closing date.

Submissions will be considered on the basis of:

- Impact: Potential to inform the science and practice of melanoma and skin cancer, has potential to significantly improve health outcomes and likely to be of interest to funding bodies
- Scientific quality: The study design and methods that have been proposed in the EOI have the potential to be developed into a high-quality research plan
- Feasibility: The investigators have the required expertise (or can access this via MASC Trials) and are likely to be able to garner the needed resources to successfully complete the project

Presentation structure

Please note that summaries new research proposals will be distributed to attendees 2 weeks prior to the CDW. Each new research proposal will have 5 minutes to present followed by 20-25 minutes of discussion/questions.
